LEARNING FROM WOMEN OF THE OLD TESTAMENT Part 4

We are encouraged to study Scripture: "All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work" (2 Tim. 3:16-17). We are studying the lives of some Old Testament women. We began with Eve, "the mother of all living" (Gen. 3:20). Then we considered the lives of Rebekah and Rachel. This month we'll look at Miriam, the rescuer of Moses.

| His sister (identified as Miriam in Ex. 15:20) risked her life to save her younger brother's life. There is little said about her relationship with Moses while they were growing up together. But we know from Exodus 3-14 that God used Moses to deliver the Israelites from the Egyptians.  |  |

| Beginning in Numbers 10:11, the people complained so much to Moses about their hardships that Moses didn't think he could carry their burdens himself. In Numbers 11:24 God put His Spirit on 70 elders who prophesied. In Numbers 11:29 Moses said, "I wish that all the Lord's people were prophets."  Even someone as godly as Miriam was not immune to spiritual pride. She might have viewed these additional leaders as a threat, while Moses saw them as a much needed asset. In Numbers 12:1 Miriam and Aaron began to criticize Moses because he had married a foreign woman. They also said, "Has the Lord spoken only through Moses. Hasn't He also spoken through us?" |  |
